Admiral Sir Christopher Myngs: a forgotten Norfolk hero

Wednesday 16th March Big School, Gresham's

Admiral Sir Christopher Myngs may have been forgotten but Holt residents were reminded of his existence when 'Rebecca's Ring' was unearthed during work to add the Meeting Room to St Andrew's Church, for Rebecca was his daughter. She had died in 1734 and among her remains was a gold ring inscribed 'June 10th 66 Sr C M', a mourning ring in honour of her father, Sir Christopher Myngs who had died in 1666.

Sir Chrstopher Myngs (right) was a larger-than-life national hero of the Second Anglo-Dutch War (1665-7) but in his younger days he had been a ruthless pirate in the Caribbean. These buccaneers were part of a British plot to undermine Spanish dominance in the region but not all of the treasure he captured was passed to the authorities. It is tempting to speculate that some found its way to his daughter in Holt.

THE HOLT ANGEL

Those of you who attended the Pop Up Art Exhibition during the 50th Anniversary Celebrations will have seen the beautiful Holt Angel painted by local artist Alison Wagstaffe. The Holt Society had contacted Alison in September 2014 to see if she might be willing to create an angel of Holt especially for the 2015 event. She has created other angels of places, more usually as individual

client commissions, and was immediately enthusiastic about the project. We gave her carte blanche to generate ideas, but agreed that the Angel should be a source of continued protection from the Great Fire of 1708. As you may know, Alison often includes angels as nurturing images of comfort, solace and protection. The resulting canvas sprang from her imagination as she was thinking about the flames licking round the angel's feet while new life in the form of trees and leaves was pouring from her hands. She also decided that the dress had to be cooling blue!

Alison has now produced a print of this original painting and has generously proposed a special price for Holt Society members of just £40.

The mounted image is 50 cm high by 41 cm wide and is a giclee print with archival quality ink on acid free paper. Each print will be clear wrapped, signed and have a unique edition number.

Back at its usual time of year **Thursday 28th April. St. Andrew's Church Hall.**


