LOOKING BACK AND MOVING FORWARD.

October 29th saw an audience of about 70 Holt Society members, visitors and guests fill the main hall of The Venue to hear Mary Alexander and Steve Benson 'in Conversation'.



Writing about the event the morning after allows for an immediacy of response and the memory of the sense of a warm and entertaining evening, with people relaxed and absorbed and privy to an intimate conversation between two people who have given many years of their expertise and considerable knowledge to the Holt Society and to the town.

Mary had compiled a wonderful illustrated narrative and led the discussion via those people who have been and continue to be influential in all that the Society stands for. Examples of various Society events over the last 50 years allowed not only for reminiscence of the activities themselves but also the historic times and events behind such celebrations.

One such was the Great Fire of 1708 the potential origins of which were illuminated by Steve with an historian's love of academic detective work. The Holt Society Golden Anniversary in 2015 spanned a whole week of celebration when the Society created multiple activities and exhibitions and installed permanent historic information boards which continue to benefit the town. Much amusement was had by memories of when Anglia TV extensively filmed Holt in colourful newly painted and floral splendour in the 1970s only to broadcast a 2 and a half minute snap shot and to add to the ignominy in Black and White.

Throughout the engaging conversation ran the Holt Society's very active involvement for the protection and the nurture of the heritage and architectural infrastructure of the town through its informative publications and active engagement with NNDC.

It drew to a close by marking the importance of Holt as a community from as long ago as its reference in the Domesday Book and to the recent celebration of that event in the installation of the Domesday Slate by Teucer Wilson in the Memorial Gardens sponsored by the Holt Society for the town.

In recognition of the importance of capturing such a conversation it has been recorded and hopefully will be accompanied with the illustrations we all enjoyed.
